We had a great turnout and a great day of fishing at the Lake Lawrence Fish-In last month. We had 8

boats and 17 anglers.

Thanks to Brian and Bree, Chuck, Daryl, Faz, Jon W and his dad, Terry S and Russ S, José, Nightbasser and the kids, Lee, Alex, Bob B, and Jim R for coming out.

Weather was beautiful and fish were on beds, mainly at the North end of the lake in the smaller bay and along the shallow shoreline.

There were several bass in the 3-4lb range and one at 5 lbs, but Daryl took big fish again with a 8lb 4oz largemouth that you can see in the picture below.





Remember, no one stays on the dock at a Fish-In.

<u>Everyone floats!</u> You don't have to pre-arrange a back seat for Fish-Ins. If you pre-arrange something with your AmBASSador, that's OK, but just because your AmBASSador can't make it doesn't mean you can't go. THE MORE THE MERRIER!



July Night Fish-In - Lake Washington

We are going to have a night Fish-In on Friday, July 13th at Lake Washington.

Meet at the Mercer Launch at 7:30 pm. We will fish until midnight and then have a little BBQ, then people can go back out until whenever. Remember to have all of your lights and emergency equipment working and batteries charged, flashlights, etc. Plan to keep your life jackets on all night – and everyone should have a backseater – pair up.

Here is some advice from Larry Sullivan from a 2004 night fish-in. (I think that was the last one we had):

"Just an idea for those who have not fished at night very much... Black buzz baits, spinnerbaits and cranks are always a must as the fish key on mass rather than color... just an idea for your shopping convenience. p.s Dull black not the glossy stuff. If you have glossy just take sandpaper to it." **July Fish-In**

When: Friday, July 13th, 2007

Where: Lake Washington

Directions to the launch:

From Hwy 405 take the I-90 towards Seattle . Take exit 8 (East Mercer Way) . At the intersection, turn left (south) onto E Mercer Way. Go back across I-90 and take the first left after the freeway on ramp. This will go down the hill to the launch . Launch fee is \$7.00



JIM RUMANN 2007 TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR Can you believe 55 people for Potholes? The last time there were 50 people at a Western Bass Club 1998 on Lake Wash-

tournament was back in 1998 on Lake Washington. Wow, nice turnout! Mr. Larry "Would

you like to see my trophy?" Sullivan was the winner with Lyle Longston and Bob Payseno rounding out the top three (see next page). Ladies you should be proud as well. Keri May landed the tournament's big fish, a 5.28lb largemouth.

On to Banks Lake. Western Bass Club, what a great turnout for the Jamboree! We had over 30 people participating

and seven in the top 20! Top honors go to Paige Jarrell with third place in her age division, and Brian Walker with seventh place in the adults. The club was fifth overall, with many more anglers than any other club. Western had a very good



showing and our conduct was exemplary. It makes me proud to be a member.

Now onto our tournament number three at Banks Lake. Where does the time go? What will all the weights be? How many people will be there? I don't know, but it should be fun. If you are not having fun, something needs to be changed. Fishing should always be fun; competition should never interfere with enjoying your day. Can you beat the fish with artificial lures or is the fish underneath your boat slapping his dorsal fin to his side telling lure jokes?

Big lakes like Banks can be intimidating for finding fish, but they shouldn't be. With so many fish in Banks, there should be plenty to be had by all. Nothing can beat a good time on the water. Tournaments are supposed to be fun,

and can be used as a learning experience. If you don't do well the first day, there are plenty of people to ask and find out what you did wrong, and what to do to have a better second day. Specifics may be a little difficult, but general information will always help.

I do have a favor to ask. For the Saturday evening potluck, there needs to be someone other than the tournament director who organizes time and place. I have too much going on to take time to run the potluck as well as the tournament. In the past it has been the top three people on the first day who organize the potluck and the BBQ. If someone has purchased all the doings for burgers, tri-tips, or brats, make sure that you pitch in for the meal. At the Jamboree, for example, one hundred dollars was spent on meat, and the person who purchased it was never reimbursed, and that gets expensive. We just need a little help and ask someone else run the BBQ. I will continue to bring my grill, but would like to have a little time to enjoy the weekend along with everyone else.

Drivers' meeting will be 6:00 am Saturday with the blast off as soon as possible afterwards. If at all possible, have your boat in the water beforehand. Weigh in will be at 3:00 pm. Closed waters will be inside the log boom at Playland. Sunday's blast off at 6:00 am, and weigh in at 1:00 pm. Launch site will be Coulee Playland, as most of us will be staying there. If you are not camping there, make sure you pay your launch fee.

Boat safety is a must. There were three boats that had trouble at the Jamboree. Be safe! Making it back in one piece is essential, and I am talking about your boat. If you have trouble, turn your banner inside out (green to orange), get to safe water or a beach, contact somebody, and have patience. You will be taken care of. Hopefully nobody will have any trouble.

Good times, trouble free, is what is desired for everyone.
