V.P./Tournament Director Report: The April club Tournament will be at Lake Washington. This is the Draw Tournament, so you do not need to pre-arrange a back seat. We will launch at Newcastle. Details are in the Newsletter and on the web-site. It looks like we will not have any potluck or other dinner for Saturday night, unless someone comes up with an idea tonight!!! The May tournament will be at Potholes on the 19th & 20th. June will be at Box Canyon, we will be staying at the Blue Slide Resort. July will be at Lake Roosevelt, August will be on the Lower Columbia, September will be at Tri-Cities, and October will be the Team Tournament on Lake Washington. 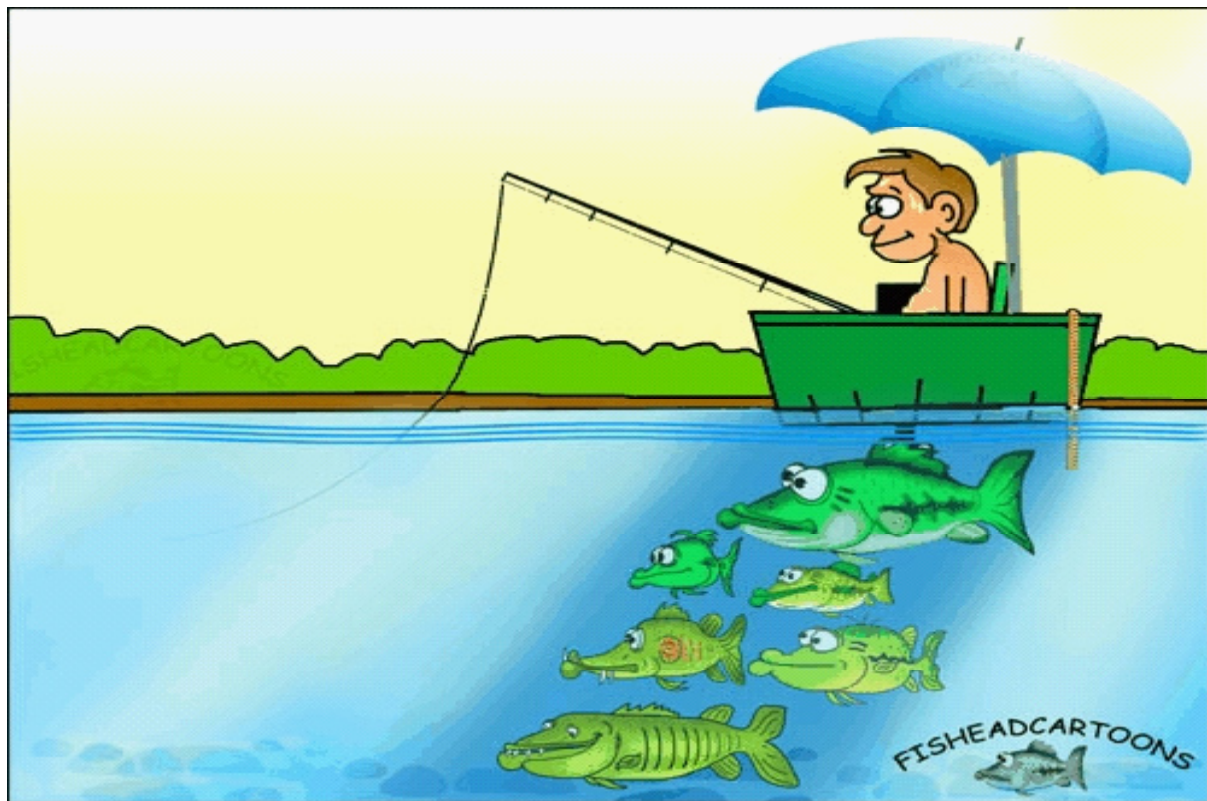
Q. Which US Company is responsible for the development of nylon fishing line?
