Outdoors Notebook -Student puts joy of fishing into action

Getting the youth of today involved with fishing will help set the foundation for the future of the sport.

One such program — the Kids All-American Fishing team scholarship and ambassador program — doesn't judge a kid on how good he or she is at fishing. Rather, it judges their ability to communicate their joy of fishing and the leadership they show by helping others in their communities.

Six young anglers were recently selected from more than 200 applicants to the 2006 KAAF program, including Nicholas Barr, 15, of Lacey.

Each receives a \$5,000 U.S. Savings Bond to use for education, and other prizes.

Barr, president and founder of the Timberline High School fishing club that involves 38 students, was awarded the scholarship in a ceremony held at the Lacey Wal-Mart Store last Saturday.

Barr, who is also a president of the Capital City Junior Bass Club, was recognized for his help in spearheading and implementing several lake clean-up, revegetation and enhancement projects.

"Our club does various conservation projects based on warmwater fisheries," Barr said. "One of them was a project where we planted trees and added vegetation along the shoreline of the Nisqually River. Another project was to renovate boat ramps at lakes in the Olympia area, and we plan to do some in King County."

When his clubs go on fishing outings, they make an effort to spend a couple hours doing clean-ups around the lakes, Barr said.

He has received numerous community-service awards, including the Perfect Citizen Award and Community Service Seal Award for the positive impact he has made in the Lacey-Olympia area. Nick Barr is a member of Western Bass Club. He is also President, Capital City Jr. Bass Club. His sponsors include: Outdoor Emporium, Lamiglas, McCoy, Ghost Baits, Fishhedz, Quickdrops and KGM Custom Baits

He first started fishing for trout in the first grade, but that got boring, and while he lost the first big bass he hooked, that was enough to set the stage for higher achievements.

"In the summer of my sixth-grade year, I got to travel to Nashville [Tenn.] and went to see the BASS Pro Shop, and that got me really hooked," Barr said.

The person who got Barr to apply for the scholarship was his science teacher at Komachin Middle School in Lacey.

"Mrs. Leonard found the scholarship program, and thought it was perfect for me since I was involved in fishing and doing conservation projects and land leadership programs," Barr said.

In addition to the scholarship bond and trophy, each team member will travel next summer to participate in the Kids All-American Fishing Challenge and Family Fishing Festival in Tulsa, Okla.

"In the event, we will match them up with a pro angler, and they get the opportunity to take part in a friendly competition which culminates in a fishing derby," said Daniel Johnson, president of Hooked On Fishing International.

"Our main goal is to expose fishing in general as a great activity for kids and families to get involved in, and reconnect them through the sport of fishing."

And what does the future hold for Barr?

"My main goal in life is to try and go professional in bass fishing, but if that doesn't happen I'd like to have a fun job in the fishing business, like being a guide or working for a fishing manufacturer," Barr said.
