President's Line

February is one of those months that get everyone excited about fishing. It's just after the winter passes and the daylight gets longer. I find myself digging through my loads of tackle making lists of what I want to buy. I think about what new techniques I want to try and thinking about patterns to use in the first few tournaments. I see posts on the website of member's premonitions about their outcomes in future tournaments. To coin a "Carlosism", people get a little "fish slap" happy. And to all this I say "Right on."

But this month besides all the excitement that cabin fever brings, the board and I will be proposing something that may cause a bit of controversy. It was mentioned briefly at January's meeting and now has been researched by myself and other members. I assure all our members that we are not entering into this proposal hastily and without thought.

We have a very enthusiastic member of our club that is interested in pursuing a dream that I would venture to say we all have had. He would like an opportunity to fish at one of the biggest fishing event in the world. He has such a passion for this sport that he dedicates a huge amount of his time helping "further the knowledge and joys of bass fishing, nature, and community spirit." What he would like from us is to practice what we preach.

The catch is that we may have to do something that in the past was and maybe is still too uncomfortable for us today. The goal is to get more kids/families involved in fishing by starting a junior club. This is where the politics come in. This is the introduction to the first of three different proposals.

First, having our club join the FLW federation. This would mean that a 2/3 vote of the attending members at the following meeting would make us eligible for all the benefits the FLW Federation has as well as its requirements. Each member would have to pay an additional fee for Federation dues. This would allow members to fish in Federation qualifying events as well as the opportunity to send junior anglers to fish these events.

Second, is maintaining our existing membership as an associate club and not becoming an affiliate club. Instead we start our own junior club that we can cultivate as our own. We will all have to step up and make a commitment to actively promote and support this new on-taking. Also commit to helping our existing junior members in the pursuit of their current goals whether physically or financially.

Thirdly and what I hope is not the direction we take, having at least six members form what is called a paper club. This would be a completely separate entity from WBC. It would have its own set of rules, by-laws and direction. It would be in no way connected with WBC except that it

When: Saturday, March 10, 2007

Directions to Shari's (Meet at 5:30 AM):

Take the I-5 SOUTH exit toward TACOMA
Take exit #132 onto WA-16 WEST toward GIG HARBOR/BREMERTON - go 22.9 mi
Take ramp toward SOUTHWORTH FY - go 0.3 mi
Turn right on **SE SEDGWICK RD** - go 0.1 mi
Turn right on BRAVO TER - go < 0.1 mi
Arrive at 221 BRAVO TER, PORT ORCHARD, on the left

Directions to the Launch (Meet at 7:00 AM):

Take I-5 South to West 16 and head over the Narrows Bridge. N on SR 16, exit at Sedgwick Rd, go E 2.5 mi; R on Long Lake Rd SE; go .4 mi; R on Clover Valley Rd, go 1.1 mi. These are the directions from the Fish and game website.

Tournament Report

Here is a list of required and helpful items for the tournament season...

Required items (and I will be more thorough in my checks this year):

- Life vest... Coast Guard approved and must FIT THE WEARER!
- Alert device... air horn and or whistle.
- Fire extinguisher, (make sure it is not expired)
- Throw cushion.
- Signal flares... at least one with good expiration.
- Kill switch for motor.
- Working livewell with aerator.
- Running lights, fore and aft, or you will be last out and restricted to running at idle in darkness, but with our weather and fog... get the lights and make sure they work.
- Insurance!

Helpful items to have:

- Extra fuses for electrical breakers.
- An oar and or push-dock pole.
- First aid kit! ... with side cutting clippers to remove hooks from body parts.
- Spare prop for big motor and trolling motor.
- Prop wrench for big motor and trolling motor.
- Tool box with various tools including Allen wrenches, spare wiring and wiring connectors.
- Spare container with 2-3 qts. of marine oil if not for you, for another who forgets theirs or runs out.
- Spare set of boat keys AND Truck keys....seen too many folks throw keys to someone on the dock only to find they cannot throw!
- Battery Jumper Cables.....they make small sets to fit easily in a box.
- Extra sunglasses and sunscreen!
- A cell phone.

So now with plenty of time... get out there and find these things and maybe even trade for stuff at the tackle swap or ask a member or two where to get these things to save time.
